Pace of Play Guidance

1. Each player should know their shot allowance and on which holes they receive shots. Pick up if you cannot score.
2. Play a provisional if there is a risk that you may not be able to find your ball.
3. As a Pair, when it is your turn to play you can decide who should play first – if one of you is in a bunker you might consider letting that player play first so they can rake whilst their partner plays.
4. In some situations it may be expedient for a player to play out of turn – for example, if you have to play out of trouble it might make sense for you to play first even if it is not strictly your turn. Ask your playing partners if it is alright for you to play out of turn as one of your opposing pair must agree - so always check!
5. Walk in if the match is concluded before the 18th, particularly those in the final match (subject to what has been agreed between Captains before the match commences). This may be relevant if weather is inclement, the start time of the match, refreshments arranged etc.
